### Halloween Trick or Treat Parade

## Rizzo's holiday collection schedule

Residents are advised to make note of the Rizzo Environmental Services collection schedule during the holiday months.

November: Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, Rizzo will not collect refuse, recycling or yard waste on Thursday, November 26. Residents whose collection date falls on the 26 will have their refuse, recycling and yardwaste collected on Friday, November 27. Please note, curbside pick-up of residential yard waste will end Thursday, December 3 and will not resume until April, 2016.

December: Because Christmas and New Year's Day both fall on Friday this year, there will be no change to Rizzo's collection schedule. Rizzo will be collecting Monday-Thursday the week of Christmas and New Year's.

All refuse, recycling and yard waste must be placed at the curb by 6:30 a.m. to ensure pick-up. Rizzo will not pick up refuse or recycling that is placed past the sidewalk on private property. All recycling must be placed separately from your refuse on the opposite side of your driveway.
