Yard waste collection ends November 30

Curbside pickup of residential yard waste will end on Thursday, November 30 and will not resume until April, 2018. All yard waste should be placed with your recyclables separately from your trash on your regular collection day.

In addition to the end of the yard-waste collection season, GFL will also be using the following holiday collection schedule:

November: Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, GFL will not collect refuse, recycling or yard waste on Thursday, November 23. Residents whose collection date falls on the 23 will have their refuse, recycling and yardwaste collected on Friday, November 24.

December: Because Christmas and New Year's Day both fall on Monday this year, there will be a one-day delay both weeks. GFL will be collecting Tuesday-Friday the week of Christmas and New Year's.

All refuse, recycling and yard waste must be placed at the curb by 6:30 a.m. to ensure pick-up. GFL will not pick-up refuse or recycling that is placed past the sidewalk on private property. 

lets you forget about parking, traffic,
and pollution, and the buses have free

When boarding the bus, have your pass, ticket or cash fare ready for the driver. A one-way cash fare is \$6.25. However, if you ride regularly, you can purchase a ten-ride ticket for \$62.50 or a 30-day commuter pass for \$125. Be sure to check with your employer, because employees of some businesses are eligible for discounted passes!

Precinct changes and new voting locations

The Canton Clerk's Office has recently made changes to Voter Precinct boundaries and voting locations. Registered voters who have been affected by this redistricting of precincts will be mailed a new voter identification card. The identification card indicates the new precinct number and the location of the voting precinct. Approximately 12,000 voters are affected by this change.

Please pay close attention to the new card, should you receive one in the mail. It is not a duplicate and indicates that you may be voting at a different location in the next election. The Village Theater and Liberty Middle School have been established as polling places, while some locations have been removed.

The changes will allow Canton to absorb up to 5,000 new voters from residential development, streamline the cost of administering future elections, reduce travel distance and time for voters, and decrease the likelihood of lines on Election Day. As a final result of implementation, Canton will see an overall reduction from 42 to 40 voter precincts and 24 to 19 polling locations, reducing the costs of future elections.

All registered voters not notified by mail with a new voter identification card are not affected by this change.
