Canton Leisure Services earns National Re-Accreditation

Canton Leisure Services ranks among the best park and recreation agencies and departments in the country by once again earning re-accreditation status through the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA) and the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA). This distinguished accomplishment was recently awarded during the 2018 NRPA Congress and Exposition in Indianapolis, Indiana.

CAPRA accreditation is the only national accreditation for park and recreation agencies and is a measure of an agency's overall quality of operation, management and service to the community. The process for re-accreditation involves self-assessments, a formal application, a site visit by a team of trained visitors that results in a written report, and a hearing with the commission to grant accreditation. To become accredited, agencies must comply with 37 fundamental standards and must meet 95% of the remaining 114 standards.

Canton Leisure Services, originally accredited in 2004, is currently one of only four CAPRA accredited agencies in the state of Michigan and was also previously re-accredited in 2008 and 2013. Leisure Services remains one of only 166 agencies in the country currently holding national accreditation, which is valid for a period of five years.

GFL's Holiday collection schedule

Residents are advised to make note of the GFL collection schedule during the holiday months.

November: Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, GFL will not collect refuse, recycling or yard waste on Thursday, November 22. Residents whose collection date falls on the 22nd will have their refuse, recycling and yard-waste collected on Friday, November 23. Please note, curbside pick-up of residential yard waste will end Thursday, November 29, and will not resume until April 2019.

December: Because Christmas and New Year's Day both fall on Tuesday this year, all Monday collections will stay the same. However if your collection day falls on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday it will be delayed by one day the week of Christmas and New Year's.

All refuse, recycling and yard waste must be placed at the curb by 6:30 a.m. to ensure pick-up. GFL will not pick-up refuse or recycling that is placed past the sidewalk on private property. All recycling must be placed separately from your refuse on the opposite side of your driveway. Clerk's Comments Election Workers Needed!

The Clerk's Office is accepting applications for the position of Precinct Inspector for the November Election.

Inspectors are needed for the November 6 elections. Applicants must be able to work closely with others, assemble simple voting stations, read and write legibly, perform basic math calculations, follow instructions provided by the Chairperson and possess inter-personal skills to work with a diverse population. Experience using a computer with a windows-based format is required.

Canton's pay scale for working the election is: Chairperson-\$190, Vice-Chair or Electronic Pollbook Inspector-\$180, Inspector-\$160 and Greeter-\$150.

Attendance at an Educational Training program is mandatory and includes \$20 compensation. All inspectors over 17 years old must be a registered voter of the State of Michigan, fill out the application in their handwriting, and be willing to declare a political party affiliation.

Patriot Park Update

Located on the northwest corner of Ford and Ridge Roads, Patriot Park is currently 134 acres of undeveloped land that was acquired by Canton Township through a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund grant for the purpose of creating a large community park. This new open space will provide both passive and active recreation opportunities.

Access to this rustic park is now available with the installation of a driveway and gravel parking lot area. Visitors to the park may now take advantage of a half-mile crushed gravel trail, during park hours from dawn until dusk.

Please note that no overnight parking is allowed and no lighting has been installed. In addition, no winter maintenance will be provided. Future amenities will include additional trails, a playground, multi-use fields, basketball courts, a pond and more. Future development of the park will take place as funding becomes available.

Canton partners with SEMCOG for pedestrian and bicyclist safety campaign

On October 1, Canton will join the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) to launch a Walk.Bike.Drive. Safe campaign to help reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries in the region. Pedestrians and bicyclists are much more likely to suffer an injury or fatality in a traffic crash than drivers. In fact, while pedestrian and bicycle crashes make up approximately one percent of all traffic crashes, they account for 30% of all traffic fatalities in Southeast Michigan.

As a partner in the regional Walk. Bike.Drive. Safe campaign, Canton asks everyone who uses the roads in Southeast Michigan to consider a few facts before getting behind the wheel, hopping on a bicycle, or stepping onto the sidewalk.

Distractions are Deadly: Walking in the safest place and maintaining awareness of your surroundings are keys to staying safe while walking. It is always a good idea for people who are walking to make eye contact with drivers before stepping onto the road. Using a crosswalk when possible is not just a good idea; it could save your life, as 70% of pedestrian deaths happen outside of a crosswalk.

Avoiding distractions and staying focused on the task at hand will reduce mistakes and prevent mistakes while driving. Most incidents are preventable, as 94% of crashes are due to human error. Keeping two hands on the wheel and two eyes on the road saves lives.

Darkness is Deadly: The most dangerous time to walk or ride a bike is early in the morning or late in the evening. Danger increases as daylight is reduced in the fall and winter months, and 65% of bicyclists' deaths happen in the dark. Bike lights and reflective clothing can help keep cyclists more visible and safer, while drivers should always be on the lookout for people on foot or a bike.

Canton continues Sidewalk Repair Program

In an effort to promote safety and enhance the community's appearance, Canton is continuing its sidewalk repair program.

The following subdivisions will be participating in the 2019 Sidewalk Replacement Program: Bi-Parkview Estates, Cherry Blossom Estates, Franklin-Palmer Estates, Forest Brook 1-2, Glengarry North, Glengarry Village 1-6, Glengarry Woods, Greenbrook Village 1-2, Kingston Estates, Nowland on The Court, Nowland Estates, Pine View Estates, Poplar Ridge and River Park 1-3

Canton's Utility Inspectors have already begun placing "Green Dots" denoting resident responsibility and "Red Dots" denoting township responsibility on sidewalk in need of repairs.

Property owners with sidewalks in need of repair will receive notification letters from Canton with a cost estimate sometime next year. The letter will also provide a date for the Public Hearing. At the hearing, Canton's Board of Trustees will review all proposed repairs in the community and either approve or deny.

Homeowners have 60 days to complete repairs following the Board's decision. Residents have the choice of letting the township's contractor make the repairs or hiring their own contractor. Residents hiring their own contractor must secure a permit from Canton's Building and Inspection Services Division and a permit from Wayne County.

Treasurer Slavens' Corner

Now that fall is here, we know that winter and freezing temperatures will soon be upon us. The freezing temperatures can freeze any water that is left in your outside pipes and faucets. This can cause a lot of damage to your home, inside and out. It is important to winterize and turn off the water to your outdoor faucets, pipes, plumbing and sprinkler system.

Many residents plan long winter vacations. It is important to make sure you do not have any dripping faucets or leaking toilets or pipes. Having someone check on your home while you are away is always a good thing.

If you are gone for a lengthy amount of time, we have many ways to pay your bill when you are away:

- Chase Bank's Pay Connexion--Enter your water account number to look up your account and schedule your payment. Payments can be made the same day or scheduled for a later date. Payments must be made before 4:30 p.m. to be credited to your account for that date. When using the Pay Connexion system, be sure your bank routing number and account number are correct. Incorrect numbers may result in your payment being returned by the bank.
- **Auto-pay**--Your water/sewer bill will be automatically taken out of your checking or savings account on the due date. You can enroll by filling out the Canton Township Auto-Pay Enrollment form found online and attaching a voided check. You can drop the form off or mail it to our office.
- Interactive Voice Response (IVR). This allows you to make a payment over the phone with your Visa, Master Card, or debit card. It is important to know your six digit account number and the amount due, you may also make a partial payment, please note that Chase Bank does charge a convenience fee of \$3.95 for the transaction. The toll free number is 1-833-679-1711.

Some residents wish to have their water/sewer bill forwarded to a different address while they are away. Water bills are not forwarded with an address change at the post office. It is important to contact the water department if you want your bill mailed to a different address, remembering to change it back when you return.

With the changes in season, I hope everyone has a wonderful and safe autumn.
